ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LEBANESE COURT OF ACCOUNTS

- Reviewing financial records of government institutions to assess appropriateness of spending
- Examining legality of financial transactions and investigating any irregularities
- O Auditing public agencies and institutions to evaluate financial compliance
- O Possessing judicial powers to take disciplinary action against financial violations
- Serving as key watchdog against corruption and misuse of public funds
- Ensuring transparency and accountability in public spending
- Combating corruption through impartial audits and investigations

It thus requires independence to function as an effective oversight body and uphold good governance









THREATS TO THE INDEPENDENCE OF COA

Budget controls and audit scope limitations

Executive interference in COA appointments or institutional barriers in Lebanon's legal framework

COA's dependence on the executive for resources, and its emphasis on preliminary over comprehensive audits, threaten independence

Lebanon's economic crisis and opaque public sector reduce COA oversight







ROLE OF THE CSOS IN SAFEGARDING COA'S INDEPENDENCE

1

Through monitoring, advocacy and reform proposals, CSOs can reinforce Court of Accounts independence from executive control

By monitoring appointments, and demanding access to reports, CSOs can fortify Court of Accounts independence







ROLE OF THE CSOS IN SAFEGARDING COA'S INDEPENDENCE

In responding to safeguard COA's independence when threats arise through using monitoring tool like the SAI Independence Rapid Advocacy Mechanism (SIRAM)

Through joint advocacy by creating local, regional and global coalitions for reforms and standards that reinforce COA's independence







ROLE OF THE CSOS IN SAFEGARDING COA'S INDEPENDENCE

By conducting citizen audits and simplifying reports, CSOs can engage Lebanese citizens on COA's role

Through collaborations with the media, universities, and legal entities aiming to strengthen CSOs technical capacity to support COA

In encouraging public participation and dialogue on audits makes COA findings more accessible
